



Paracelsus Biological Medicine Seminar Series November 2006 to September 2008

The Paracelsus Biological Medicine Network is pleased to present an intensive two-year training in the field of Paracelsus Biological Medicine consisting of four weekend conferences alternating with four clinical workshops. The total course of eight weekends is designed as a comprehensive overview of the principles and practices of Paracelsus Biological Medicine. A training manual and a recommended reading list will accompany this course. Certificates will be given upon completion of each seminar and workshop.

To be considered PBM certified and receive the final diploma a participant must be an allied health care practitioner and fulfill the following requirements: attend the four seminars and workshops (total of eight), present a full case study, write a paper of a minimum of 2,000 - 3,000 words (see page 10 for essay topics) and fulfill the required reading list.

Receipt of the final diploma entitles practitioners to stay at the Paracelsus Klinik, Lustmühle, Switzerland for a week long individualized internship and also an invitation to attend further advanced seminars given by the Paracelsus Biological Medicine Network.

The four main seminars will focus on fundamental principles and specific diagnostics and therapies unique to Paracelsus Biological Medicine and will be held in the Marion, MA area. The accompanying hands-on workshops, which will be held at the Whole Life Clinic in Santa Fe, New Mexico will allow participants to further learn and practice diagnostic and therapeutic skills. Workshops are an integral part of this course and will allow participants to observe and engage in patient cases.
